

- Implemented the new Deputy Chief of Operations position.

Emergency Medical Services Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation

- Responded to 4,443 emergency medical calls.
- Enrolled 2 personnel into the Certified Emergency Paramedic (CEP) program at Yavapai Community College.
- Enrolled 3 personnel into the Certified Emergency Paramedic (CEP) upgrade program.
- Implemented new Emergency Medical Service training and tracking program.
- Partnered with Yavapai Regional Medical Center to teach two run reviews to local Emergency Medical Service providers.
- Trained all fire personnel on advanced Capnography interpretation.
- Recertified 14 Certified Emergency Paramedics.
- Recertified 15 Basic Emergency Medical Technicians.
- Instructed 75 CPR / First Aid classes to area professionals and residents for a total of 1,725 students.

Fire Prevention

- Reviewed 1,197 plans for new subdivisions and buildings.
- Trained 3,000 students in fire and life safety.
- Received and cleared 320 life safety complaints and customer service requests.
- Conducted 2,621 fire inspections.
- Conducted 31 fire investigations.
- Received \$5,000 in grant money for public education and child safety seats.
- Two commercial buildings were saved by fire sprinkler systems.
- Currently in the process of adopting 2006 International Fire Code and Wildland Urban Interface Code, as well as written amendments for both.

Hazardous Materials Response Team

- Fifteen certified Hazardous Materials Technicians
- Certified three new Hazardous Materials Technicians.
- Secured \$7,000 in Homeland Security grants to purchase four gas detection meters.
- Participated in the regional EOC drill at Tim's Toyota Center.
- Conducted 375 hours of technician level training.
- Conducted monthly team training.
- Maintained a seat on the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC).
- Responded to 155 hazardous condition or materials calls.

Training

- Conducted 27,575 man-hours of in-service training.
- Conducted proficiency testing of all personnel with 100% passing.
- Personnel received specialized training in: National Incident Management System, Incident Command System, IS-700 (Independent Study, National Incident Management System An Introduction), IS-800 (Independent Study, A National Response Plan), I-200 (Incident Command for Single Resource and Initial Attack incidents), I-300 (Extended Attack Incident Commander), I-400 Advanced Incident Command, S-420 (Command and General Staff), Arizona Public Service, Unisource, Airport Driving, Airport Crash Fire Rescue (Live Fire), Technical Rescue, Confined Space Rescue, High Angle Rescue, Swift Water Rescue, 5 Week Hazardous Materials Technician, Emergency Medical System, Wildland Firefighting, Incident Simulations, Infectious Control, Truck Company Operations, Save Your Own Rescue, Search and Rescue, Water Tender/Water Shuttle Operations, Leadership and Fire Service Management Training, and Helicopter Operations.
- Established week long PFD Captains Academy for 3 newly promoted Captains. Invited Acting Captains to attend portions of the academy.
- Established a 4 hour monthly Acting Engineer/Engineer class.

- Sponsored and conducted 10 classes open to other agencies.
- Conducted 8 months of multi-agency/multi-engine company drills (22 engine companies per month).
- Conducted 2 months of multi-agency live fire drills.
- Conducted 2 months of multi-agency hazardous materials drills.
- Conducted 2 months of multi-agency incident command "simulation" classes.
- Conducted 2 months of wildland fire refresher training.
- Conducted 7 Acting Engineer written tests.

Technical Rescue Team (TRT)

- Seven certified TRT personnel.
- Three certified TRT instructors.
- TRT personnel completed swift water training at the Salt River and Kern River and self rescue training on the Animas River.
- Participated in confined space drills and structural collapse training in Sedona.
- Preparing to instruct regional Technical Rescue Technician 200-hour certification course.
- Received Homeland Security grant funding to purchase an all-terrain vehicle/trailer, Stokes basket, rotary hammer drill, speed shoring, submersible pumps, and Ellis clamps.

Wildland / Fuels Management "Crew 7" Granite Mountain Hot Shots (T)

- Performed 2,193 detailed home assessments using the "Red Zone" program.
- Assessed 325 existing homes for vegetation removal.
- Performed 141 (85.5 acres) new home inspections for compliance with IWUI code.
- 63 (41 acres) homes were treated for fuels reduction by "Crew 7".
- "Crew 7" completed 181 chipping jobs, an estimated 383 tons.
- The City of Prescott transfer station took in 2,475 tons of brush from the general public.
- "Crew 7" completed 1 mile of fuel-break on Mt. Francis.
- "Crew 7" felled 47 full-sized trees.
- Granite Mountain Hot Shots (T) spent 98 days fighting off-district fires.
- Suppression personnel responded to 8 out of district assignments.

Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting (ARFF)

- A total of 700 hours of ARFF training was completed.
- Nine Engineers certified in ARFF.
- Sent personnel to Boeing-Mesa facility for annual live fire training.
- ARFF Engineers completed an ARFF 40 hour training class.
- Eight ARFF Engineers completed an airport familiarization, driving and communications training class.
- Federal Aviation Administration, Embry Riddle Aeronautical University and ARFF personnel combined together for several live training drills.
- ARFF personnel have trained numerous airport employees and Embry Riddle Aeronautical University students in fire extinguisher safety.
