



Whether you are a "world class" Olympian or a novice willing and able to enter the Prescott Senior Olympics, our goal is to treat everyone as a "Winner". If you look closely at the combined "Schedule of Events", there is surely at least one which you will find fun and self-fulfilling. Please become a Prescott Senior Olympian — enter today!

General Information

Event/Game Dates.....Friday, August 8 through Sunday, August 24, 2008.

Eligibility“Young at Heart” Seniors, 50 years of age and up on or before December 31, 2008, for all events in the 2008 Prescott Senior Olympics. Refer to the “Rules and Regulation” section in this Booklet.

Gender DivisionsFor all “Physical” events, excluding Coed Sports, Men and Women will compete separately. For all “Leisure” events (Pinochle, Scrabble, Poker), there will be no gender separation or distinction.

Age Categories.....For all “Physical” events, the Prescott Senior Olympic Committee will strive to coordinate competition and fellowship in five-year age groups (50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80+). To insure adequate participation however, certain events may have to be combined into 10-year increments. In these cases, medals will still be awarded in the announced five-year increments, provided the individual/team participates.

Participation InformationParticipants should plan to be at their event(s) at least 30 minutes prior to the announced starting time(s) indicated on the “Schedule of Events”. Specific event “Rules and Regulations” are outlined in the following section of this Registration Booklet.

Events postponed due to inclement weather will be rescheduled as soon as possible. Cancellation of events will only occur as a last resort. Make-up information will be available at the event site. You may also call 777-1122,

for current event cancellations. As always, you may also call the Prescott Recreation Division Programming Office, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 8:00am – 5:00pm for personal assistance on all matters pertaining to the Senior Olympic Games. That phone number is (928) 777-1122.

All requests for accommodations regarding special equipment or assistance for people with disabilities will be entertained. Accommodations will be made when possible.

Part of Senior Olympics is joining together as “good sports.” Good sportsmanship is needed and expected. If necessary, Event Officials may disqualify participants not adhering to these values.

Equipment All equipment will be provided, except the following; tennis and racquetball racquets, eye guards and goggles, horseshoes, weight lifting belts, softball bats and softball gloves, helmets, bicycles, bows and arrows, golf clubs, golf balls and all equipment for shooting sports. Eye guards are required for racquetball. Participants may bring most personal equipment, and please bring personal game sets for the “leisure” type games, if possible.

Awards All medallions will be presented on-site at the COMPLETION of the event/meet. Olympic style medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finishers in each competitive event, for each gender, division, and age category offered.

Age categories will be followed for awards purposes, as designated, even in the instances where age groups have been combined due to insufficient entry, as long as individuals/partners/teams compete with younger participants (physical events). Individuals/partners/teams are not entitled to medals by default, in cases where there is no opposition. All Olympians must attend, and compete with another age group, in order to be a “medal winner.”

Spectators/Fans Family, friends, and the general public are encouraged and personally invited to support their “heroes”, and if we can’t get you to play along, please attend the events as spectators.

Medical There will be medical personnel available on-site at some of the events. If you must be transported by ambulance, fees apply.

Physical Therapy Massage therapy services will be on-site during some of the events.

Entry Deadline Most events require actual registration at least three days prior to the starting date. We hope you enjoy the original events you participate in and then decide to enter additional events (normally at least three days prior). There will be some exceptions to this entry deadline procedure, as entry will be needed a little sooner for a few events. Entry deadlines are indicated within the “Rules & Regulations” for each event/game. On site entries available for the following events: Equestrian, Pinochle, Poker, Scrabble, Running and Mountain Biking. (**No T-Shirts for on-site registration**)

Entry Information....For Individual as well as Doubles/Partners entry, each Individual and/or Partner must submit a separate and completed (both sides) registration form with appropriate and full payment for total participation. These forms are provided in this Booklet.

For Team events (Softball, Volleyball, Basketball), Team Managers are responsible for submitting total team fees and a completed “Official Team Sports Entry Application”, also provided in this Booklet. Team rosters will be provided on-site, and all participants will need to sign team rosters/waivers prior to their team’s first game/match.

Please refer to the “Schedule of Events” to avoid conflicts and to allow for necessary transportation time between events.

Please do not select two events that will be conducted at the same time. Review the event schedule and choose only those events that do not conflict. The Prescott Senior Olympic Committee cannot guarantee exact ending times for each event, so again, use careful judgment in your personal selections.

Registration Fees.....Individuals: Registration is \$20.00 per person. Unless otherwise noted, event fees are an additional \$5.00 per event. Participants will receive a Prescott Senior Olympics t-shirt and gift bag. Each entrant must register and participate in at least one event to receive a souvenir T-shirt. For an additional \$10.00, instead of a t-shirt participants may opt to receive a Prescott Senior Olympics Polo Shirt (collared shirt). **Orders MUST be received with Registration prior to July 25.** Please make checks payable to “City of Prescott.” Any questions regarding registration or competition can be directed to the Prescott Recreation Division Programming Office, phone (928) 777-1122, fax (928) 771-5843, or email libby.reiman@cityofprescott.net

Teams.....Team fees have also been established based on \$20.00 per person. This entitles all rostered players to receive the same benefits as “Individual” entrants (refer to above paragraph under “Registration Fees”). Teams may choose to roster additional players, at \$20.00 per player. Once a participant is officially rostered/registered, they may elect to enter other Individual or Doubles/Partners Senior Olympic events offered. Participation in additional events will simply cost \$5.00 per event, including additional volleyball events.

Additional User Fees .Additional user fees required are for participants entering the 18-Hole Golf Tournament at Antelope Hills and Racquetball at Downtown Athletic Club. Golfers will need to pay an additional \$25.00 at time of registration (green fees and cart accommodations). Racquetball is an additional \$10.00 per day.

Refunds In the event you are unable to participate in the 2008 Prescott Senior Olympics, after you have officially registered, said moneys will be retained as a donation unless you notify the Prescott Recreation Division, in writing, prior to August 8, 2008, of your desire to be fully refunded. Failing to “show” for an event or events will not warrant refund.

Senior Olympic Shirts All registered participants of the 2008 Prescott Senior Olympics will be given participation T-shirts. All Olympians will receive their T-shirts at their first event site. Additional T-shirts may be purchased (\$10.00 each; \$15 for polo shirt), if they are not ALL already on Olympians’ backs!

Separate Men's/Women's Divisions. Age groups will be as follows; 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, and 80+. This event will consist of 12 ends of 5 arrows each. 60 arrows for a best possible score of 300. All arrows will be shot from 15 yards. The target face will be a single target with 1 bullseye. This face will have scoring rings for 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1. A total miss counts for zero. There will be duplicate scoring and "x" ring scoring as well. the bullseye is about 3" in diameter. Whistle signals by the Range Captain will start the shooting, stop shooting, and indicate that scoring needs to begin. Standard archery range safety rules will be observed throughout. There will be a rest break after 6 ends have been shot for score.

Double Elimination or round-robin format, based on entries. Only an underhand swing of the racquet is permitted while serving. The service is considered overhand and illegal if the shuttle at the instant of being struck is higher than the server's waist.

The server starting play stands in the right half of the court and serves to the opposite right hand half court. If the server wins the point, server then serves from the left hand half of court and into the opposite left-hand half side. Thus, service is always in the right half court when the server's score is an odd number. The server continues until an ace is scored against him/her. Only a server can score points. Lights and ceilings are out. Participants may bring their own racquets, however, rentals will be available.

You must have a partner at the time of registration. Separate Men's, Women's, and Coed doubles: 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, and 80 plus. The game of bocce is easy and fun. It is not strenuous and takes no previous experience. "Play-

ing Rotation" will be maintained throughout each game. The first player (flip of the coin), will throw the pallino into the opposite court. That player also rolls the first Bocce ball. The idea is to get as close to the pallino as possible. The opposing team throws until they get a ball closer to the pallino. Play then returns



to the first team who must try to get a ball "inside" that ball. Throwing by each team continues until a ball gets "inside" or all 4 balls are tossed. Matches will be played to 15 points, and a "win by 2" rule will be in effect. Scoring is done after all Bocce balls are thrown by both teams. There is no minimum distance to the pallino. 1 point is awarded for each ball that is closest to the pallino and "inside" of any opponent's ball. At least 1 and as many as 4 points may be obtained to a team each frame. Single Elimination or Round-Robin Play will be used, based on total team entries.



Six (6) players per table. The deal rotates with eight (8) cards dealt to each player. Players bid on the cards they are dealt. If all players pass on bidding, the dealer gets a bid of one (1). Trump will only be made if a player has nine (9) or a marriage (King or Queen of a particular suit – i.e., hearts, diamonds, spades or clubs). Otherwise, a no trump hand will be played. If a player bids on his/her hand and doesn't make the bid, he/she goes down double, if played. If a player throws his/her hand in, he/she goes down for 10



the initial bid. Other players receive their meld points. If played, players receive their meld for their score, if they take a trick. One player shall keep score for their table. The total score for each match will be 100 points; point count will be in units of 10s, not 100s (i.e., a run is 15, not 150). Additional questions will be resolved before match time. Scores will be counted to a cut off time of 10 pm.

Separate Men's and Women's Singles and Doubles Competition. Players will be allowed to compete in up to three events. Events with three participants will play a round robin format. Events with more than three participants will play a double elimination format. Participants will need to indicate Singles and/or Doubles at time of registration. Age groups are in five-year increments, 50-54 through 80 plus. Where there is insufficient competition in any one age group, the group will play down to next lower age group to assure matches and competition for all. However medals will still be awarded in five-year age groups. Tournament format and time schedule will be determined by number and "mix" of participants. U.S.R.A. rules will apply. Approved protective wear must be worn during all warm-up and matches.
