
Permit Conditions

1. The quantity of water stored shall be reported to the Recharge, Assured & Adequate Water Supply Program, Water Planning Division, Arizona Department of Water Resources, 3550 North Central Ave., Phoenix, Arizona, 85012 in the form of annual data reports. The annual report shall be submitted no later than March 31 following the end of each completed annual reporting period. The first annual reporting period shall be from the effective date of this permit through December 31, 2015. Subsequent annual reporting periods shall be January 1 through December 31.
2. The Permittee shall continue to meet the requirements of A.R.S. § 45-831.01 during water storage.
3. This Water Storage Permit is designated as storing **non-recoverable** water at the

permittee's request pursuant to A.R.S. § 45-833.01(A). Therefore, water stored pursuant to this permit may not be recovered on an annual basis, credited to a long-term storage account or used for replenishment purposes. A.R.S. § 45-833.01(B).

4. Water may be stored pursuant to this permit only at the City of Prescott Recharge Facility Constructed Underground Storage Facility Permit No. 71-519567, and any amendments thereto.
5. The Director may withhold long-term storage credits or prohibit recovery on an annual basis for water stored under this permit during any period of time for which the director of environmental quality has issued a final determination of a violation of the water quality limits contained in Aquifer Protection Permits P-101733(Airport) and P-100353(Sundog) if the Director determines, after consultation with the director of environmental quality, that the violation has had or will have a significant adverse effect on aquifer water quality.
