**Minutes of the Pedestrian, Bicycle & Traffic Advisory Committee, held on December 10, 2018 in the Public Works Conference Room, located at 433 N. Virginia Street, Prescott, Arizona.**

**A. Call to Order – Bill Fanelli, Chairman**

**C. Approval of Minutes from November 19, 2018 Meeting**

**GEORGE SHEATS MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM THE NOVEMBER 19, 2018 MEETING; JIM KNAUP 2ND MOTION, - PASSED 4-0.**

**D. Marigold Speed Hump Request – Paul Sandstrom**

Mr. Sandstrom was not in attendance, so the discussion on this item was brief. Mr. Sandstrom first made a request for speed humps on Marigold Drive in 2011. At that time a speed study was conducted and found that 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speeds were 26 in one direction, and 29 in the other. As the speeds were not in excess of 7 miles over the speed limit, the request did not meet the criteria of the Traffic Calming Policy and Mr. Sandstrom’s request was denied. Recently Mr. Sandstrom asked that the City take another look at Marigold Drive. He indicated that there are additional renters on the area and drivers continue to speed. Staff is working with Citizens on Patrol to place a radar sign at this location to gather additional information. Mr. Sandstrom submitted a petition, with only 4 signatures. This item will be placed on the January 14, 2019 agenda for further discussion and attendance by the resident.

#### E. Thumb Butte Road Improvements Update

Ian is still working on finalized striping plans, and will bring them to the next Committee meeting.

#### F. Safety Concerns from Committee Members

George Sheats brought up an issue with parking at Heritage Park Zoo. Currently overflow parking is located beyond the entrance to the park along Heritage Park Road. There was a problem with trucks using this area for overnight parking, so Recreation Services posted "No Parking" signs. Additionally, this overflow parking area is not ideal for zoo visitors, because they need to walk along the shoulder of the road to reach the zoo. The idea of changing the signs to read "Zoo Parking Only" was discussed, as well as creating a new parking area across from the zoo in vacant land. Ultimately this is a Recreation Services decision.

#### G. Monthly Review of Bike and Pedestrian Collisions

There were no bicycle or pedestrian related collisions in the past month.

#### H. Current Road Project Updates

- Carleton/Cortez Project begins this week – the project includes reconstruction of utilities, new pavement, sidewalk and ADA ramp improvements, bulb outs at the intersections, new striping which includes bike sharrows symbols, and traffic bollard sleeves. George Sheats asked about the use of audible pedestrian push buttons on this project and the downtown in general. He has been working on a grant that could possibly fund some of these improvements if the City wants them.
  - Rosser Street – striping/signing will be brought back in January for committee review.
  - Robinson Drive project is ongoing. Sidewalk will run the entire length of the project.
  - Zone 16 Tank, Haisley – now includes 5' sidewalk on the south side between Valley Circle and Senator Highway.
  - Prescott Lakes Parkway @ Willow Lake Road signalization project is at 90% design. Sidewalk and curb ramp improvements are included on the south side.
  - There was discussion about a planned roundabout at the Summit Street intersection.
  - There was discussion about adding 8 high intensity flashers at the roundabout on Willow Lake Road at SR89 to improve pedestrian safety. Ian will research the cost for these flashers, and will present them at the January meeting.
  - Discussed future road design in Deep Well Ranch.


J. Next Meeting


K. Adjournment
