Minutes of the Pedestrian, Bicycle & Traffic Advisory Committee held on **Monday, June 10, 2019**, in the **Public Works Conference Room**, located at **433 North Virginia Street**.

**A. Call to Order – Bill Fanelli, Chairman**

The meeting was called to order at 9:34 a.m.

**C. Approval of Minutes from May 13, 2019 Meeting**

**GEORGE SHEATS MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM THE MAY 13, 2019 MEETING; SANDRA SMITH 2<sup>ND</sup> MOTION, - PASSED 8-0**

**D. CYMPO – Chris Bridges**

Mr. Bridges made a presentation on the CYMPO 2045 Regional Plan and Transit Implementation Plan. The presentation included ADOT funding plans for the future and showed that expansion funds are no longer available in future years with funding to be used for maintenance, planning and safety.

**E. Connectivity Projects Overview**

George presented his draft Connectivity Project Map that includes a variety of projects that span private development, capital improvement projects, Trails, Parks, and many more.

Ian Mattingly asked George if the next draft of the map can include color coding by type of project i.e.; drainage, trails.

Future discussion will take place with Ian and Joe Baynes.

#### F. Discussion of Traffic Calming Policy Changes

Ian presented the current draft of proposed changes to the policy. They include changes to several sections related to the thresholds, additional “toolbox” definitions, and cleanup of the language.

Jim Knaup pointed out a few edits for continuity as well as additional verbiage for the Program Goals and Objectives to include visitors and all users of our traffic system.

Dennis Stringer asked if there is a list of connector roads available. Ian stated the list is linked in the policy that was adopted in 2010 and will need to be updated to include new roadways.

Members were instructed to send suggested revisions to Ian and he will review, revise and present at the next meeting.

#### G. Discussion on City Council Traffic Study Session

Public Works will be presenting on traffic at the June 25<sup>th</sup> City Council study session. Ian Mattingly asked if members had topics of interest that they would like to have researched and possibly included in the presentation.

Bill Fanelli asked if traffic counts, bicycle counts and pedestrian counts can be presented to show perspective of our traffic overview.

George Sheats mentioned that the choke points in the system should be looked at.

Dennis Stringer would like discussion on intersection capacities so that future projects can be identified and planned for.

Sandy Stutey would like a transit component to be discussed to get bus stops on the radar for planning of future projects.

#### H. Safety Concerns from Members

The members have no new safety concerns at this time.

#### I. Monthly Review of Bike and Pedestrian Collisions

Whipple and Prosser – The pedestrian was crossing 5 lanes of traffic when they were hit by a vehicle. The driver was able to brake and slow below the posted speed limit of 40 MPH but could not avoid hitting the pedestrian who was crossing mid-block. No citation was given to either party. Improved education for pedestrians was suggested.

Iron Springs Rd and Ainsworth – A bicyclist riding on the sidewalk against traffic was hit by a car turning right from the minor street. No citation was given. Education to encourage bikes to ride with the direction of traffic was discussed.

J. Current Road Project Updates

- S. Washington – installing curbing and catch basins.
- Carelton/Cortez – paving has started this week.
- Prescott Lakes Pkwy/Willow Lake Rd – signal work underway.
- Mt. Vernon – median islands are installed, the striping contractor will obliterate some of the bike lane striping and re-stripe the intersection.
- West Gurley from Park to Grove – working on approval to change striping to one travel lane and bike lane in each direction with a center turn lane.
- Thumb Butte striping modification will be done in July.

K. Upcoming Major Pedestrian Related Projects

Ian mentioned that the ADOT SR69 project will look at extending the 10' wide multi-use path from Target east to Lamb during the current planning phase.

The Willow Lake Rd. roundabout is being prepped for the installation of the rapid flashers for the crosswalks.


L. Next Meeting


The next meeting will be held on July 8, 2019.
