<p>Prescott's Urban Water Cycle (February 2018 and January 2019)</p>	<p>How does water move through the City's water infrastructure from the time it is pumped to when it is returned to the aquifer? Utilities Manager Eric Bay answered questions.</p>
<p>How a Watershed Work (March 2018 and February 2019)</p>	<p>We learned what we can do to protect our watershed with Environmental Coordinator Matt Killeen and Stormwater Specialist Oren Thomas</p>
<p>Prescott's Water History (April 2018)</p>	<p>Prescott has an amazing and dynamic water history! Presented by local historian and retired Prescott National Forest Supervisor Mike King.</p>
<p>Gallons Per Capita Per Day (May 2018 and April 2019)</p>	<p>GPCD is a way to compare our community's water usage with others, plus we learned about indoor water conservation.</p>
<p>State of Arizona Water Management (December 2018 and March 2019)</p>	<p>The Arizona Department of Water Resources presented along with Jim Holt of Matrix New World on Arizona water management.</p>
<p>Outdoor Water Conservation (June 2018 and May 2019)</p>	<p>We explored native landscaping, rainwater harvesting, and other outdoor water saving techniques for the Prescott area.</p>
<p>Utility Billing (July 2018)</p>	<p>Denise Moore, Utility Billing Manager, discussed the tiered rate structure, the cost of water, and answered your questions.</p>
<p>Rainwater Harvesting (June 2019)</p>	<p>Nick Balik from Prescott College discussed Passive and Active Rainwater Harvesting systems.</p>
<p>City of Prescott Water Management (August 2018 and July 2019)</p>	<p>In 2019, water management and potential policy changes were presented by Senior Attorney Clyde Halstead</p>
<p>Big Chino Water Ranch (September 2018 and October 2019)</p>	<p>Why and how the Big Chino Water Ranch was acquired for our community needs.</p>
<p>Recharge and Recovery (September 2019)</p>	<p>The City's recharge facility was discussed and the renewable supplies sent to it.</p>
<p>Water for New Development (October 2018 and November 2019)</p>	<p>The State of Arizona assured water supply requirements for new subdivisions was discussed.</p>
<p>Groundwater (November 2018 and August 2019)</p>	<p>The supply for the region, and the long-time commitment to City water customers.</p>



Conservation Tips

Indoor Water Conservation

1. Find and fix leaks
2. Update water fixtures
3. Monitor your household use, shortening your shower by a minute or two and you'll save 150 gallons/month!

Outdoor Water Conservation

1. Plant low-water use plants suitable for this region.
2. Water with a drip system between 8 PM and 8 AM.
3. Use passive or active rainwater harvesting.
