Minutes of the Art in Public Places Committee Meeting held on January 13, 2020 at the Prescott City Hall, Lower Level Conference Room, located at 201S. Cortez Street, Prescott, AZ 86303.

- A. Call to Order at 10:13 am by Ron Miller.

- C. Approval of Minutes from regular meeting on August 30, 2019. Motion made to approve by Tom Restifo, seconded by Michael Rothmiller, all in favor, approved.
- D. Discussion and consideration of Art Donation Agreement from Prescott Area Art Trust for "If Horses Could talk". Toni gave an update on the encroachment permit stating that she received an update from the City Public Works department that the encroachment permit is about 45 days away from being received. As soon as Public Works receives the permit, Toni will bring this back to the committee, and she will also contact the donor about the process.
- E. Discussion and consideration of Art Donation Agreement from Carl Mueller for "Into the Breach". Stan Goligoski made a presentation of "Into the Breach"; artist is Stuart Brown, of the UK. This print is named after Kayla Mueller for Operation Kayla Mueller and the print represents what was described in the operation. Stan explained that the

Mayors Commission for Veterans initiatives asked if this piece could be displayed at the new airport terminal and that the Mayor agreed and as did several City Council members. Presentation includes proposed location at Prescott Regional Airport, the new terminal, primary option is in the meet and greet lobby and a second option is the holding room. Permanent location would be the Prescott Regional Airport, but the piece would rotate on display in various locations throughout Prescott until Prescott Airport Terminal is completed. The Commission for Veterans initiatives will take care of moving the piece. There would be no costs to the City. The artist is donating the print to the family who is donating the piece to the City and has received permission to put this on public display. The print will be framed in a thick wooden frame; two colors of matting, green and white and will include three placards with brass engraving, and a picture of Kayla approved by Carl and Marsha Mueller. The Print will have a UV glass cover to protect the print. Ron Miller explained that a "permanent location" is defined by the City and that the City has to approve or disapprove – City Council is the final authority. Ron advised to take this idea to City Council when the print is ready. Carl Mueller thanked the committee for addressing this piece. Carl explained to the Committee how his son and family received the print and how he sent a picture of this to Stan Goligoski. Stan summed up that this a moment of history for Prescott and everyone involved throughout the nation – just like Ernest Love Field, named after the WW I flying ace, who was from Prescott.

Thomas Restifo motioned to approve, seconded by Michael Rothmiller, all in favor approved. Alex Rudolph arrived at 10:40 a.m.; Ron Miller gave Alex an update on the meeting.
