Tuesday, March 2

“Circle #332” – This hike starts at Iron Springs road and drops down into a small canyon before climbing up again as we head North on trail 332. This is an out and back hike.

Level: 3

Directions: Drive Northwest out of Prescott on Iron Springs Rd to trail head at milepost 4.4. Turn left onto dirt road and cross cattle guard. Park along either side of this road. Walk across Iron Springs Rd. to access trail.

Thursday, March 4

“Brownlow from Overlook” – “Pioneer Park Trails” – An extensive system of loop trails in Pioneer Park located to the south of the softball fields. The terrain is mostly flat with several rolling hills. The route hiked will be determined by the hike leader the day of the hike.

Level: 2.5

Directions: Park at the overlook off Pioneer Parkway in between WilliamsonValley Rd and Commerce Drive.

Tuesday, March 9

“Feldmeier Trail” – Newer trail near Goldwater Lake that follows parallel with Senator Hwy intersecting Banning Creek Trail #330. This is a beautiful hike through an open Ponderosa Pine forest. This is an out and back hike.

Level: 2

Directions: From Gurley Street, take Mt. Vernon Street (turns into Senator Highway). The trailhead is on the left about ½ mile past the entrance to Goldwater Lake. This is the same parking area that is used for trails 62 and 299.

Thursday, March 11

“Willow Lake to Willow Dells” - Take a hike around the lake, past the Cottonwood Peninsula over to the Willow Dells loops

Level: 2

Directions: Meet behind Willow Creek Park/ Dog Park at trailhead. Dog Park is located off Willow Creek Rd, across from the auto dealerships.

Tuesday, March 16

“Butte Creek”– Trail winds by the side of the Hassayampa golf course and development area. Rolling trail offers nice views of golf course. Will be an out and back hike; fairly steep.

Level: 3

Directions: Go west on Gurley Street to Sherwood Drive, one block past the entrance to Hassayampa Village. Turn left on Sherwood and follow it until you see Stricklin Park on your left. Park along road and walk across the creek to the trailhead.

Thursday, March 18

“Aspen #48 to Moby #737”- Hike upward to Mt. Francis through Ponderosa forest with rocks, lichen, and junipers. Out up and back down.

Level: 3

Directions: Take Copper Basin Road to the Aspen Creek trailhead. It takes about 25 minutes to drive from the White Spar Safeway, to carpool meet at the White Spar Safeway.

Tuesday, March 23

“Garden Party Trail” – Beautiful forest trail parallel to the Miller Creek. Fresh air and refreshing, wooded scenery. Trails 324, 332, and 318 which loops back to the Painted Rock parking area.

Level: 3

Directions: Go west on Gurley Street approximately 1 mile past Thumb Butte Recreation area. Park at the Painted Rock parking area.

Thursday, March 25

“Trail #393 to Trail #327” - Forest hike with some steep hills.

Level: 3

Directions: Take South Montezuma to Copper Basin road. Turn right on Copper Basin and continue for 4.8 miles to the Aspen Creek Trailhead. Give yourself about 20 minutes from town to reach trailhead.

Tuesday, March 30

“Flume Trail to Watson Dam”- The Flume Trail leaves the trailhead on Granite Dells Road and heads toward the base of the Watson Lake Dam. There is some overland hiking eventually leading to Granite Creek and up to the base of the Dam. This can be an out and back hike or a “lollipop hike” involving some connecting trails that climb out of the creek bottom.

Level: 3

Directions: From the Watson Lake roundabout on Hwy 89, drive North on Hwy 89 to Granite Dells Road. Turn right on Granite Dells road and watch for the parking area to the right. There is limited parking at the trailhead. Carpool from Watson Lake Park off Hwy 89 if possible. There is no fee for parking at the trailhead, however, if you carpool from Watson Lake Park you will be in a C.O.P Fee Area
